Patient-Centered Care in Focus:

In February, the NCDHHS Division of Public Health, Reproductive Health Branch hosted a webinar devoted to skill building around strategies and counseling techniques that promote client-centered contraceptive care. This webinar was not recorded, as participants were invited to practice these strategies through role play in small groups. However, the following tools and frameworks were shared and are available to you to enhance your practice.

• <u>Shared Decision-Making Framework from Partners in Contraceptive Choice</u> and <u>Knowledge (PICKK)</u>

• This website offers a poster and video to walk you through the PHI CARE framework, which can be used once a patient has said they would like to discuss contraception during their visit. It guides providers through discussing the patient's contraceptive history by asking about past experience, health history, and importance (PHI) and to deliver patient-centered counseling through counseling, autonomy, review, and experience (CARE).

• <u>Affirm, Share, Ask Cycles for Person-Centered Counseling from the Reproductive Health National Training Center</u> (RHNTC)

 RHNTC offers a series of videos for family planning staff that encourage building rapport, demonstrating empathy, sharing information in a way that prioritizes using plain language that can be easily understood, and asking open-ended questions to the client. A <u>printable palm card</u> is also available to remind you of these steps.

No matter what framework you decide to use based on your personal style and counseling practices, we hope that you will remember that there is no "best" method of contraception for everyone. Finding the preferred method that aligns with the client's individual **values**, **preferences**, **needs**, **and desires** should be the goal of every encounter. Patient-Centered Care in Practice: Fact Forward

Title X services are supportive of adolescents who are seeking reproductive health care. This population is at a <u>higher risk of experiencing unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections</u>, which is why Title X clinics should encourage **confidentiality**, **accessible hours**, **sliding scale fees**, **and client-centered care**, all of which could encourage young adults to access reproductive care services.

<u>Fact Forward</u> is a South Carolina based non-profit that has been leading work on advancing adolescent health education since 1994. They provide training, curriculum, and technical assistance in the Carolinas to ensure that those working with young adults can provide medically accurate information about contraception and safer sex practices. Their website has great information and <u>printable resources</u> for parents, educators, health care providers, and faith leaders about how to reach out to the adolescents in their life and begin having conversations about healthy relationships and their reproductive health.
